Rachel's son came to Oak-Leyden due to a severe speech delay. After receiving athome therapies, he was able to pronounce almost all sounds by his third birthday. "My husband and I often laugh," says Rachel. "Because for a little boy who didn't talk once, he doesn't stop now!"





William, who has lived in an Oak-Leyden home for ten years, makes the world a brighter place as a greeter at Sam's Club. Only 15% of people with developmental disabilities in the United States find work in their communities. Oak-Leyden's Supported Employment Program is proud to have helped William identify and maintain a job he loves.

José is an enthusiastic member of Oak-Leyden's Adult Choir and an active participant at our Oak Park Lifelong Learning Center. He enjoys the close friendships he forms at his day program and the value he brings through choir performances. José and the choir keep a busy schedule, especially around the holidays when they perform at the Oak Park Main Library.





Children's Services

Oak-Leyden programs served 399 children from birth to five from 26 different communities in 2017, with 98 graduating from the Early Intervention Program for ages three and under.

342 children with developmental disabilities or delays received direct therapy from physical, occupational, speech-language, and/or developmental therapists. 48 children received professional screenings.

22 children gained hands-on experience with instruments through Music Together® classes, and 35 children came to therapeutic drop-in playgroups.

100% of children showed gains in one or more specific

area of development.

Children's Service provides support for children with developmental disabilities from birth to age 5 and their families. Therapy is provided on-site and in a child's natural environment, as staff work with each child's caregivers to take advantage of everyday learning opportunities. Children also benefit from therapeutic playgroups.

Charlie's Story

Charlie Carpenter came to Oak-Leyden in 1993 after being diagnosed with Cat eye syndrome. At fifteen months, he was not walking or attempting to formulate words, and had clear behavioral issues.

Through Oak-Leyden's Children's Services, Charlie received occupational, speech, and physical therapies. During group therapy sessions at Oak-Leyden, Charlie was introduced to different sensory activity stations, including ones that featured simple instruments for musical play.

"Even before he could communicate and put words together, he was responsive to music," says Julie Carpenter, Charlie's mother.

The journey into music that began at Oak-Leyden helped lead Charlie to becoming a professional pianist and organist known for his "perfect pitch." Today, Charlie is a well-respected performer and is employed as a church musician for St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Lakeview and St. Giles Catholic Church in Oak Park.

The personal support Oak-Leyden's Children's Services provided made a transformative difference for Charlie and his family.

"Oak-Leyden gave us the knowledge we needed to advocate for Charlie throughout his life," says Julie. "We are so grateful for the community connections we made and for all the people who rooted for him to succeed."

Patrice has been an upbeat and enthusiastic participant at our Oak Park Lifelong Learning Center for almost two years. She truly enjoys attending our day programs and is known for her impeccable style and fashion sense.

A member of the Oak-Leyden Adult Choir, Patrice loves singing in and around her community. She has developed many new skills through the vocational activities and classes she engages in at Oak-Leyden. "I've learned how to be independent," she says. "I can do more things on my own now."

Yolanda Thomas, who works with Patrice at the Lifelong Learning Center, is impressed with how far she has come in the past year and a half.

"In the beginning, when Patrice joined us, she had trouble making friends," says Yolanda."She has many friends now. She's made great progress."

"Oak-Leyden helps me stay focused," says Patrice. "I really grow here."



Adult Residential Services & Lifelong Learning Centers

In 2017, Oak-Leyden provided family-style housing to 54 individuals in 12 community integrated living arrangements through our **Residential Services**, and 100% of residents met at least one goal in their person-centered plans.

Over 880 medical visits were made to our organizationally operated **Multidisciplinary Clinic**.

125 individuals participated in our **Adult Lifelong Learning Centers**, where they learned valuable life and vocational skills.

42 adults secured or maintained job placements in their communities through our **Supported Employment Program**.

Residents in Oak-Leyden community integrated living arrangements receive 24-hour support and care that promotes their personal autonomy and physical well-being. Oak-Leyden also operates two adult day programs in Oak Park and Elmwood Park, where participants with developmental disabilities learn the skills they need to live as independently as possible.


